## What do I do?

Read the task and write a speech. You will need to consider your audience (who you're addressing in your speech) and the purpose of your speech.

### **Top Tips!**

- Take time to plan your work (5 mins)
- Read the question. If the question asks you to include certain points, make a note of them in your plan and remember to include them.
- Remember the key features of a speech and try to include as many features as you can.

### Features

#### Features of a speech - don't be scared!

#### Facts and statistics

Involve facts and numbers to support your views and ideas (Just make them up!) 40% of 11 year olds own a mobile phone



#### **Emotion and exaggeration**

Address your audience and include thoughts and feelings in your speech – even if it is going a little over the top! *Imagine being a lost child without any means of communication, disconnected from the entire world*!



#### Alliteration

Catchy alliterative phrases will make your speech more memorable. Technical teens, picky parents and tiresome teachers

#### Rhetorical questions, rule of 3 and repetition

Ask your audience questions to make them think and to put themselves into a situation that you are describing. Repetition will make your speech more memorable, especially if they are within a group of three. *How would you feel without your mobile phone? Lost. Isolated. Disconnected. Children need communication, children need interaction and children need trust.* 



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
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
