- Revise common letter strings and word patterns.
 You could try words with the following letter strings: 'tion', 'cian', 'our', 'ure', 'ous' or 'igh'.
- Study words with common prefixes and suffixes.
- See how many words you can find with silent letters or double consonants.
- Find as many homophones as you can (words that sound the same but have a different meaning/spelling).
