Top Tips!

- Focus on one pattern change at a time and eliminate the incorrect answers first.
- There could be more than one change - this could be a rotation, colour change, something could be added or taken away and some will be easier to spot than others.

What skills do I need to improve?

- Doing lots of practice questions will help with becoming familiar with question types but what else can you do to improve in this area?
- Becoming familiar with question types in NVR will help you to understand what you need to do and give you more time to focus on spotting patterns and answering the questions.
 - Once you've understood a question type, see if you can create your own to try out on other people. It can give you a break from completing questions and will further your understanding.

How many sides does an **icosagon** have?



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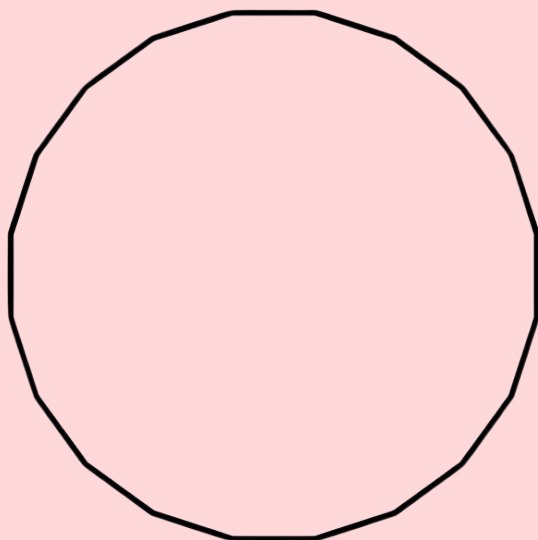
Answers

1. **D** - The shape is rotated 180° and the colours are inverted.
2. **D** - The figure is reflected and the colour of the arrow is inverted.
3. **A** - The background shape is rotated 90° clockwise and the front shape is reflected.



An Icosagon

It has so many sides, it almost looks like a circle!



An icosagon is a 20-sided 2D shape.
