- 5) disenchanting & usual the other words mean 'unusual'
- 6) adverb & adjective the other words are terms to describe literary devices
- 7) napkin & chair the other words are types of spoon
- 8) marble & granite the other words are categories of rock
- 9) **trumpet & tuba** the other words are woodwind instruments
- 10) **knowledgeable & wit** the other words mean 'inexperienced'
