What do I do?

The following sentences contain **two words** that have been swapped over, *no other words have been moved*. Underline the two words that need to be swapped over for the sentence to make sense.

Top Tips!

- Read the whole sentence first to get a feel for it. You may recognise the words straight away.
- For trickier sentences, read a couple of words at a time to see if they follow each other correctly.
 Remember, the swapped words will stay the same, they won't change tense or spelling.

What skills do I need to improve?

- You can create your own shuffled sentence questions at home by choosing a sentence from a book and asking a friend to swap two of the words around. Try this with a range of genres.

 mistakes.
